Executive Summary

250 million children are out of school and 600 million more are in school but not learning: 70% of ten-year-olds in low-income countries cannot read a simple sentence. Education systems add capacity linearly while the learning crisis compounds. This blueprint deploys the one technology that changes the slope — a personal AI tutor for every learner — inside franchise economics that make excellent education a profitable village business. Deadline: 31 December 2030.

Beyond tutoring, the plan rewires incentives end-to-end: microschool franchises that outperform at \$6/month, Skills Passports that make competence — not certificates — tradeable, learn-to-earn contracts where employers fund mastery, and a Learning Outcome Exchange that pays investors when children verifiably learn. Education stops being a cost center and becomes the world's best-yielding asset class.

Core Thesis

1. One-to-one tutoring is the most effective intervention ever measured (2-sigma gains); AI has just made it free — universal mastery is now a distribution problem.
2. Parents in poor communities already pay for education (\$60B+/year in low-fee private schools); give their money 10x better instruments and the market builds the school system.
3. When verified learning gains are tradeable (LOU: Learning Outcome Units), capital flows to pedagogy that works, and bad schooling loses its funding within two semesters.

Key Findings

- Ten ventures achieving universal foundational literacy and numeracy at \$19 per child-year — versus \$150-400 in traditional systems with worse outcomes

Why Business-as-Usual Fails the Deadline

Building schools and training teachers at historical rates closes the gap by 2080. Only zero-marginal-cost pedagogy, parent purchasing power, and outcome-hunting capital close it by 2030.

Venture 1: Universal AI Tutor (UAT)

Pedagogy: mastery loops, spaced retrieval, Socratic prompting, emotional check-ins; parent reports weekly by voice note. Marginal cost \$0.90/child/year; free to families — funded by LOU buyers and employer pipelines.

Venture 2: The 2-Hour School Day Stack

Two hours of AI-tutored core academics unlock the day for projects, sport, crafts and enterprise — the model top microschool networks now validate. Ships as an operating system (schedules, projects library, assessment) any school can adopt for \$1/child/month.

Venture 3: Learning Twins and Early-Warning

Each learner's mastery graph predicts dropout and stall risk 8-12 weeks ahead, triggering guide outreach and family nudges; churn in pilots falls by half.

Chapter 4: Schools as Franchises of Excellence

Venture 4: Microschool-in-a-Box

A 60-child neighborhood school: trained guide-couple, UAT devices, projects kit, solar, safeguarding protocols, and quality telemetry. CAPEX \$7,500; fees \$4-8/month; guide income 1.8x public-teacher salary; corporate quality audits monthly. Target: 400,000 microschools by 2030.

Venture 5: Guide Academies

12-week conversion of underemployed graduates and respected community women into learning guides; paid apprenticeships inside operating schools; 3 million guides certified by 2030.

Venture 6: EdNode Upgrades for Existing Schools

Public and low-fee private schools adopt the stack via revenue-neutral contracts: the operator is paid only from verified LOU gains, never from school budgets. The Trojan horse that upgrades incumbent systems without fighting them.

Chapter 5: Competence Markets

Venture 7: Skills Passports

Proctored, anti-fraud, portfolio-plus-assessment credentials on an open ledger covering 400 competencies from literacy to TIG welding to prompt engineering. Employers query passports like APIs; 2,000 employer signatories at launch commit to interview-by-competence.

Venture 8: Learn-to-Earn Contracts

Employers and staffing platforms pre-purchase competencies: learner tuition is financed against signed first-job terms with wage floors, capped repayment, and zero-interest structure. 30 million youth financed by 2030.

Venture 9: The Learning Outcome Exchange (LOX)

A Learning Outcome Unit is minted per child per verified grade-level-equivalent gain (independent adaptive testing, biometric-proctored, 2% human audit). Philanthropies, diaspora funds and future-workforce corporates buy forward; school operators finance growth against LOU inventory. Target: 1.5 billion LOUs by 31.12.2030.

Venture 10: Girls Completion Compacts

Conditional family stipends funded by LOU premiums (girls' verified completion mints 1.3x units), plus safety transport franchises and female guide quotas — closing the gender completion gap as a priced feature, not a hope.
